OUR YEAR AT A GLANCE

In our 2022-2023 reporting year, the CAG network delivered some impressive achievements! We are proud to share the impact of the network and grateful to all those who showed up for their communities last year.

The network clocked in over 97,650 volunteer hours which has a value of £1,572,995 and equivalent to 50 full time jobs!

More than 80,000 people participated in over 4,000 events, activities and outreach programmes! That's enough people to fill five and a half football pitches!

These activities resulted in approximately 198 TONNES of food diverted from waste, preventing nearly 500 TONNES of carbon dioxide emissions.

Throughout the year, groups planted over 6,000 trees and hedgerow plants.

GARAGE SALE

21 groups ran 172 REPAIR CAFE events enabling members of the public to 'fix not bin' broken household items, from electrical appliances and bicycles to clothes. We also launched THREE new Libraries of Things!
